Our Uses and Disclosures of Sensitive Personal Information

Taro uses and discloses sensitive personal information only for the following purposes:

- Performing the services or providing the goods reasonably expected by an average consumer who requests those goods or services.
- Ensuring security and integrity.
- Preventing, detecting, and investigating security incidents that compromise the availability, authenticity, integrity, or confidentiality of stored or transmitted personal information.
- Resisting malicious, deceptive, fraudulent, or illegal actions directed at the business and prosecuting those responsible for those actions.
- Ensuring the physical safety of natural persons.
- Short-term, transient use, including, but not limited to, nonpersonalized advertising shown as part of a consumer's current interaction with the business, provided that the consumer's personal information is not disclosed to a third party or used to build a profile about the consumer or otherwise alter the consumer's experience outside the current interaction/
- Performing services on behalf of the business, including maintaining or servicing accounts, providing customer service, processing or fulfilling orders and transactions, verifying customer information, processing payments, providing financing, providing analytic services, providing storage, or providing similar services.
- Undertaking activities to verify or maintain the quality or safety of a product, service, or device that is owned, manufactured by, manufactured for, or controlled by the business, and to improve, upgrade, or enhance the service or device that is owned, manufactured, manufactured for, or controlled by the business.

Your Rights

- **Right to Notice.** Before or at the time we collect personal information from you, you have the right to receive notice of the personal information (including sensitive personal information) to be collected, the purposes for which we use it, whether or not that personal information is Sold or Shared, and the length of time we intend to retain each category of personal information. This Supplemental Notice is intended to satisfy this requirement.
 - You also have the right to request that we disclose to you the categories of personal information we have collected about you in the preceding 12 months, along with the categories of sources from which the personal information was collected, the purpose for collecting the personal information, and the categories of third parties to whom we disclosed the personal information.
- **Right of Access.** You have the right to request that we disclose or provide you with access to the specific pieces of personal information we have collected about you.
- **Right to Correction.** You have the right to request that we correct inaccurate personal information that we maintain.
- **Right to Deletion.** You have the right to request that we delete the personal information we collect from you. However, in certain situations we are not required to delete your personal information, such as when the information is necessary in order to complete the transaction for which the personal information was collected, to provide a good or service requested by you, to comply with a legal obligation, to engage in research, to secure our websites or other online services, or to otherwise use your personal information internally in a lawful manner that is compatible with the context in which you provided the information.
